## Detachment Focus and Priorities

The OPP's action planning process ensures compliance with the Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services Regulation (Adequacy Standards) filed as O. Reg. 3/99 in 1999.

Through assessment, analysis and consultation, the following areas of focus were identified for the next three years (2020 – 2022) in Essex County:

### Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence
- Address & prevent property crime
- Address & prevent illicit drug crime
- Support victims of domestic abuse
- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations

### Traffic:

- Year-round focus on causal factors of motor vehicle collisions with a focus on (Big 4) Aggressive Driving, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving and Use of Seatbelts
- Marine enforcement and security on local waterways
- Streamline collision reporting


### Other Policing Priorities:

- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service




## Top Calls for Service <sup>1</sup>











### Calls for Service<sup>3</sup>




- A **9.9% increase** in Calls for Service January 2024 compared to January 2023




## Violent Crime<sup>4</sup>

## Property Crime<sup>5</sup>




- An **3.5% increase** in Property Crime in January 2024 compared to January 2023. **Clearance Rate = 16.0%**




## Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)<sup>9</sup>










## Provincial Offences<sup>12</sup>

## Traffic Enforcement<sup>13</sup>




- An average of **22.6 recorded vehicle stops per day** (701 stops) in January 2024 compared to the 2023 average of 23.1 stops/day.

## Notable Investigations

Lakeshore	<p>A 47 yr. old male has been charged with First Degree Murder after the death of a 47 yr. old male from Lakeshore. The Criminal Investigations Bureau continues to lead an extensive investigation involving multiple support units.</p>
Lakeshore	<p>A 37 yr. old male has been arrested and charged with Theft Over x3, Theft of a Motor Vehicle and Fraud Over x3 after a romance/medical scam that began in 2022 totalling more than \$370,000. In January 2024 the male then emptied the victim's home of his belongings, stole valuables and cash, then fled in her vehicle. An arrest warrant was obtained and weeks later, the male turned himself into police. The same male was wanted by Toronto Police for a similar offence.</p>
Leamington	<p>Officers were dispatched to an abandoned vehicle call in which a property owner became suspicious of a large dump trailer that had been left on his property for over 2 months. It became clear the trailer was not related to a nearby construction project when the male tried to move the trailer in the middle of the night with an under-sized truck. A 51 yr. old male was charged with Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Over and Resist Arrest.</p>
Tecumseh	<p>Two ongoing investigations related to grandparents scams valued together at over \$14,000. In one incident a male attended the residence to collect \$8,000 and was photographed. In the other, a female was captured on ring cam attending to collect over \$6,000. Both suspects are yet to be identified.</p> <p>A further \$70K was fraudulently obtained from various victims throughout the county through a various banking, police and fake prize scams.</p>
Essex	<p>In January a Leamington area business reported a B&amp;E and theft of a pick-up truck. CSCU members reviewing occurrences noted a possible connection between the pick-up and video evidence related to the theft of an enclosed trailer from Colchester. Members patrolled known areas and eventually located the stolen pick-up truck parked in Colchester. CSCU members then conducted surveillance and observed a male enter the driver's seat while a second male walked towards the vehicle with tools in hand. The vehicle was boxed-in and both males, aged 51 yrs. and 36 yrs. were arrested. The older male was charged with Possess Property Obtained by Crime and Possess a Schedule I Substance. The younger male was charged with Possess Break-In Instruments and Possess a Schedule I Substance x2.</p>
